However, through the Ayushman Arogya Mandir initiative, we have adopted a holistic and integrated approach—covering preventive, promotive, curative, rehabilitative, and palliative care," he said.

He announced the government is ambitious goal of establishing **1.75 lakh Ayushman Arogya Mandirs**, building upon the **30,000 already operational** under the National Quality Assurance Standards (NQAS). These centers are designed to provide **universal**, **free**, **and comprehensive primary healthcare**, with an emphasis on wellness and delivering services closer to the community.

HorShri Nadda praised **Symbiosis Arogyadham** as an exemplary model of this vision. "Delivering high-quality care completely free of cost is a formidable challenge. Yet, Symbiosis Arogyadham has made it possible. It stands as a testament to what is achievable when institutions and the government work in synergy to craft inclusive health policies," he stated.

Vision of Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam

In his presidential address, Respective **Dr. S.B. Mujumdar** reflected on the deeper philosophical foundation behind the initiative. "All of us dream—and even God dreams. One of His dreams is to create a space where humanity unites under the principle of Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam—the world is one family," he said.

Dr. Mujumdar emphasized that for India to become a **Vishwaguru** (world teacher), it must be guided by **spiritual values** and the inclusive ideology of global kinship. He also highlighted the transformative role of **technology in connecting humanity across borders**.
