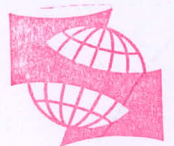

2.2 Eligibility Criteria

- Students must meet defined criteria to apply for committee roles.

General eligibility may include:

- **Enrollment in a full-time academic program**
- **Good academic standing** (backlogs or CNG/TNG)
- **Satisfactory attendance** (e.g., 75% or above)
- **No history of disciplinary action**
- **Genuine interest or relevant experience** in the committee's area

Additional criteria may apply for leadership roles (e.g., final-year students, prior experience, teacher recommendations).

2.3 Selection and Appointment Process

- A transparent and merit-based process, typically involving:

Step-by-step process:

1. **Application Submission**
 - Students fill out an application form with required details and documents.
2. **Initial Screening**
 - Faculty coordinators and current committee heads review applications based on eligibility and completeness.
3. **Interview or Interaction (Optional)**

 - d) **Minutes of Meetings (MoM):** The Student Secretary under the guidance of Faculty In charge will be responsible to maintain and circulate the MoM as per approved format.

- **Secretaries:**
 - Support the Head by managing documentation and communication.
 - Maintain records of meetings, events, and decisions.

 - **Sports Committee:** Intra-college tournaments, fitness challenges, sports day.
 - **Literary Committee:** Essay competitions, debates, creative writing workshops.
 - **Social Welfare Committee:** Blood donation camps, cleanliness drives, awareness campaigns.
 - **Academic Committee:** Guest lectures, peer-learning sessions, academic competitions.
 - **Health & Wellness Committee:** Yoga day, mental health awareness week, wellness workshops.

6.2 Proposed Timeline

- Annual/ month-wise or semester-wise schedule of planned events.

7. Reporting and Documentation:

7.1 Meeting Schedule and Minutes

- **Meeting Schedule:**
 - Predefined schedule for regular committee meetings (monthly, quarterly, or as needed).
 - Shared with all members in advance to ensure availability and participation.
 - Includes date, time, venue/online link, and agenda.
- **Minutes of Meetings:**
 - Documented summary of discussions, decisions made, and action points.
 - Maintained by the Committee Secretary.
 - Shared with all members and stored for official records and accountability.



- **Includes:**
 - Date & time of the meeting
 - Attendees
 - Key discussions and resolutions
 - Assigned tasks and deadlines
 -

7.2 Activity Reports and Feedback Mechanism

- **Activity Reports:**
 - Prepared after each event or initiative.
 - Includes:
 - Objectives of the activity
 - Execution summary
 - Participation details
 - Outcomes and observations
 - Photographs (if applicable)
- **Feedback Mechanism:**
 - System for collecting feedback from participants, attendees, and stakeholders.
 - Methods may include:
 - Online forms or surveys
 - Suggestion boxes
 - Post-event debrief sessions
 - Helps evaluate impact and improve future activities.

8. Code of Conduct:

8.1 Expectations and Responsibilities:

- All committee members are expected to:
 - **Actively participate** in meetings, planning, and execution of events.
 - **Maintain professionalism** and represent the committee positively.
 - **Collaborate effectively** with peers, faculty coordinators, and other committees.
 - **Meet deadlines** and complete assigned tasks with accountability.
 - **Uphold institutional values** of inclusivity, respect, and service.
- Specific responsibilities may vary by role:
 - **Heads:** Leadership, decision-making, delegation, representation.
 - **Secretaries:** Communication, documentation, logistics.
 - **General Members:** Execution support, idea contribution, outreach.

8.2 Disciplinary Guidelines:

- To ensure proper conduct and a respectful environment, the following apply:
 - **Punctuality and regular attendance** in committee activities is mandatory.
 - **Misconduct, negligence, or disruptive behavior** may lead to warnings or removal from the committee.
 - **Violation of institutional rules**, including academic dishonesty or harassment, will result in disciplinary action per college policy.
 - **Escalation Process:**

- First warning (verbal or written)
- Review by Discipline Committee
- Possible suspension or replacement
- Members must acknowledge and agree to these terms upon joining.

9. Acknowledgements:

9.1 Faculty Advisors

- **Role & Responsibilities:**
 - Provide **guidance, mentorship, and oversight** for each committee.
 - Ensure that all activities align with **institutional goals and policies**.
 - Offer **advice on planning, execution, and conflict resolution**.
 - Review and approve **event proposals, budgets, and reports**.
 - Serve as a **point of contact** between the administration and student committees.
- **Engagement:**
 - Attend key meetings and major events.
 - Offer constructive feedback and support for student-led initiatives.
 - Promote a collaborative and learning-focused environment.

9.2 Student Contributors

- **Definition:**
 - Students who contribute to committee activities without holding formal roles like Head or Secretary.
 - May assist on a **project/event basis** or as **volunteers**.
- **Responsibilities:**
 - Support logistics, publicity, participation drives, or documentation.
 - Bring in **creative ideas, technical skills, or community outreach** support.
 - May be **recognized in reports or certificates** for active contributions.
- **Value:**
 - Encourages **broad student involvement**.
 - Builds leadership and teamwork experience.
 - Acts as a **talent pool** for future committee roles.

10. Annexures:

10.1 Application Form Template

A standardized form used to invite student participation in committees.

Typical fields include:

10.2 Evaluation Criteria

Used by faculty coordinators and current committee heads to assess applicants.

Criteria may include:

- **Interest and motivation** (as reflected in Statement of Purpose)
- **Relevant skills and experience** (e.g., organizing, writing, public speaking, sports)
- **Academic performance and attendance record**
- **Communication and teamwork abilities**
- **Past contributions to events or college activities**
- **Interview performance** (if applicable)

Scoring rubrics or selection checklists can help maintain transparency and fairness.

10.3 Recording and Showcasing Events

Used to showcase past achievements and inspire applicants.

1. Planning & Preparation

Define Objectives and Metrics

- **Goals:** Clearly define what you want to capture for every event. Objectives could include increasing participation, winning awards, spreading positive impact, or inspiring peer engagement.
- **Key Metrics:** Identify and standardize the data to be recorded for all events:
 - **Event Summary:** Title, date, venue, and brief description.
 - **Participation Numbers:** Total attendees, breakdown by student level/department if applicable.
 - **Outcomes:** Achievements, learning points, fund raised (if any), or follow-up actions.
 - **Awards/Recognitions:** Any accolades received or notable achievements.
 - **Student Feedback:** Surveys, direct testimonials, and impact stories.

Create Standardized Recording Tools

- **Templates & Forms:** Develop digital and/or paper-based templates for:
 - Pre-event registration
 - On-site attendance counters and checklists
 - Post-event feedback forms (with both quantitative and qualitative sections)
- **Consent Management:** Ensure guidelines are in place for obtaining consent for photographs and recording testimonials.

Assign Roles and Responsibilities

- **Data Collection Team:** Volunteers or designated committee members responsible for keeping records.
- **Media Team:** Subgroup to capture photographs and video snippets during the event.
- **Editorial Team:** Responsible for compiling testimonials, editing impact stories, and finalizing the event report.

2. Pre-Event Phase

Announcements and Registrations

- **Promotions:** Utilize college bulletin boards, email newsletters, social media, and campus apps.
- **Registration Data:** Have an online sign-up system that also gauges expected participation. This early data helps tailor resource allocation.

Preparation Meeting

- **Kickoff Briefing:** Conduct a briefing session with the team to go over data collection tools, roles, and the importance of capturing every insightful detail—from numbers to nuanced feedback.

3. During-Event Documentation

Real-Time Data Capture

- **Attendance & Participation Numbers:**
 - Utilize digital check-in methods (QR codes or sign-in sheets).
 - Use manual headcounts to reconcile digital records, if necessary.
- **Event Records:** Log the sequence of events, timings, and highlights throughout the day.

Photographs and Video Documentation

- **Photography:** Capture high-resolution images of key moments (such as group photos, speakers, interactive sessions).
- **Video Clips:** Short video testimonials or interviews on the spot add value for post-event storytelling.
- **Consent:** Make sure that the media team gets prior or on-site consent for capturing and later publishing photographs/testimonials.

In-the-Moment Testimonials and Feedback

- **Live Interviews:** Designate a sub-team to conduct quick interviews or record spontaneous student comments.
- **Capturing Impact:** Ask questions such as “What does this event mean to you?” to generate authentic impact stories.

4. Post-Event Review & Analysis

Data Consolidation

- **Collate Data:** Gather all attendance numbers, media files, and feedback forms. Use a central digital repository (like Google Drive or a shared network folder) with carefully labeled folders for each event.
- **Review Team Meeting:** Within a week of the event, arrange a debrief to compile preliminary outcomes, discuss student feedback, and note any awards or recognitions.

Reporting Template Development

- **Event Summary Report:** Create a standardized document that includes:
 - **Overview:** Brief summary and objectives of the event.
 - **Participation Numbers:** Detailed statistics possibly in a table.
 - **Key Outcomes:** Achievements, skills gained, and follow-up initiatives.
 - **Media Gallery:** Embed selected photographs and short video links.
 - **Testimonials:** Quotes from participants along with impact stories.

- Awards/Recognitions: List any honours or special acknowledgments received.

5. Reporting and Archiving

Regular Reports

- Monthly/Quarterly/Annual Reporting: Consolidate all events into a periodic report that highlights trends, highlights the most impactful events, and shows progression in participation and outcomes.
- Presentations: Create interactive dashboards or PowerPoint presentations for Student Council Meetings and college-wide communications, emphasizing key stories and visual evidence (photographs, video testimonials).

Digital Archive

- Central Repository: Organize all reports, images, and testimonials in a digital archive categorized by academic year or semester.
- Accessibility: Ensure that the repository is accessible by all relevant parties (e.g., committee members, college administration) for transparency and historical reference.

6. Feedback Loop & Continuous Improvement

Student Feedback Integration

- Survey Analysis: Regularly analyze survey feedback and individual testimonials to understand what aspects of the events were most impactful.
- Impact Stories: Develop detailed case studies or narratives based on student feedback that highlight the transformation or inspiration derived from the event.
- Iterative Improvements: Use this qualitative and quantitative data for planning improvements for future events.

Recognitions and Awards

- Internal Celebration: Recognize committee members who excel in organizing or have contributed significantly. Record and publish these recognitions alongside event reports.
- External Awards: If applicable, highlight any external awards or accolades the events have received, detailing the criteria and significance.

Additional Considerations

- Technology Integration: Consider adopting mobile event tracking apps that enable real-time data submission and even automated report generation.
- Stakeholder Engagement: Regularly share condensed versions of these reports with the larger student body and college administration to build transparency and celebrate collective achievements.
- Feedback Forums: Organize periodic open-forum sessions where students can directly share their impact stories, adding a dynamic layer to the static reports.

By following this roadmap, the Student Council Committees at SMCW can ensure a consistent, transparent, and engaging process for recording and reporting all important aspects of college events—from numbers and photographs to personal impact and awards. This process not only strengthens event planning and execution but also builds a rich historical archive that can inspire future events and committee members.
